

Thursday, Sept. 1, 2016: Wildlife Photography – Brent Paull

Birding Information: Marcia Grefsud will discuss the life history of American Bushtits based on her observations of a breeding pair over a five year period.

Main program: Wildlife Photography - Brent Paull

Main Program: Brent Paull will share his wildlife images from the American West, and will discuss locations, photography tactics, and image processing techniques. Brent has spent more than 700 days shooting in Yellowstone, and today spends nearly 100 days a year leading photo safaris in the field. Here in California he is best known for his bobcat photography, with his safaris drawing photographers from around the world.



During his senior year at BYU, Brent and a friend made a trip to Yellowstone National Park in September 1985. That trip led to his first published article and published photos and a re-awakening of his adventures as a youth in California. From that point on he was determined to create a life for himself in nature in the western United States, through photography and by writing about all he saw and discovered. He spends most of his time leading photo safaris around the west, many in California, and teaching photography in 22 cities, still does some commercial photography, and actively sells his images as stock and fine art.
